Our key services include:

Face-to-face and virtual support groups – meeting regularly for information, sharing of personal experiences, hints and tips and for social support

Advice and information service – advice, information and guidance to anyone with central vision loss, including family friends and carers

Telephone befriending

Telephone treatment buddies – Providing information and reassurance to people who are newly diagnosed or experiencing treatment for the first time

Telephone counselling – one-to-one, confidential support from a trained counsellor **Skills for seeing** – one-to-one training and information to help people make the most of their vision to do the things they love

Connect by tech – one-to-one support to help others make the most of technology to aid daily living

Mentoring – offering support through sharing of personal experiences in many areas of life including employment, parenting and everyday life.
