





Annual Report for LeDeR Programme in Lincolnshire 2022-2023

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What is LeDeR?



LeDeR is about learning from the lives and deaths of people with a Learning Disability, and autistic people



LeDeR is a Service Improvement Programme



This report uses the information from the Lincolnshire LeDeR Reviews for local autistic people and people with learning disabilities

It covers the period from 1st April 2022 to 31st March 2023



It aims to share what we found out, and what actions Lincolnshire's Integrated Care System [LICS] is taking from this information, to improve local services

All local LeDeR reviews look at information about:-



Who the person was

Where and how they lived

and, how old they were when they died

Lincolnshire Data 1 April 22 - 30 March 23

Currently in Lincolnshire: -



- 14,000 adults with a diagnosis of learning disability
- 11,782 adults diagnosed with Autism



<u>Data of Lincolnshire LeDeR</u> Referrals received

Notifications received

There were 49 adult notifications received in Lincolnshire between April 2022 and March 2023. A **DECREASE** of 13 from 2021-22.

49



Notifications allocated

48 notifications were allocated for initial or focussed review during the year.

Reviews completed

There were 44 reviews completed and signed off in the year. That is an **INCREASE** of 9 from the previous year.

Reviews completed within 6 months

57% of reviews signed off between April 2022 and March 2023 were completed within 6 months.



Reasons for 6-month breaches

The most common reasons for the 6-month time limit on reviews being completed in Lincolnshire for 2022-23 were:

1. On Hold with the Coroner

2. Reviewer Workload



Child reviews

There were 2 child reviews received during the year, 4.17% of the total notifications. A **DECREASE** of 8.50% from 2021-22.







Data from Lincolnshire LeDeR Referrals

Sex

61% of people in the Lincolnshire data who died in 2022-23 were male and 39% female.

Age at death

The median age of death for people with a Learning Disability or Autism was 57. The average life expectancy for the general Lincolnshire population is 81.

Diagnosis

43 of LeDeR reviews in 2022-23 were for patients diagnosed with a LD (90%). The remaining 10% were diagnosed with a LD &

Autism.



Ethnicity

100% of people who died in 2022-23 in Lincolnshire identified as "White British".

Early death

More than 6 out of 10 of those who died in Lincolnshire with a LD and/or Autism died before they were 65. This compares to around 1 out of 10 in the general population.





National Learning Examples / LeDeR Focus:-



Epilepsy is more common in adults with a learning disability than those without a learning disability; It is more common amongst men and those with a higher level of impairment



The Purple Light Toolkit has been implemented as a resource supporting service improvement in epilepsy across Lincolnshire.

THE IMPORTANCE OF ACCESSIBLE ANNUAL HEALTH CHECKS

- An independent study on Annual Health Checks was completed by Virginia House, a local Day Care Centre
- Lessons learned were shared locally about how Annual Health Checks could be made more accessible
